

INTRODUCTION

CO. O'O'RES GALLEGE

Devi Charan Barua Girls' College is the first under-graduate girls' college in Upper Assam and second oldest among the women colleges of the state. Since its inception in the year 1955, it has been striving incessantly to spread women education in Assam. The college was established with generous contributions made by the four illustrious sons of Late Rai Bahadur Devi Charan Barua, viz., Heramba Prasad Barua, Umacharan Barua, Deba Prasad Barua and Bishnu Charan Barua. Starting with a modest enrolment of only 56 students and 12 teachers in the Arts Stream, the college has now grown from strength to strength and accommodates approximatly 1800 students from diverse backgrounds, communities and states of North East India in Arts and Science faculty.

Over the years, the college has produced women who have excelled in diverse professions and have contributed in numerous ways to the society at large.

During the 67 years of its glorious existence, the college has not only distinguished itself as one of the premier Degree Colleges of the State but also of the NE Region of India.

The Science Stream was added to its wings in 1981 and since then it has developed itself into a full fledged one with well equipped laboratories. The 10+2 programme offered by the college is affiliated to the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC), while its Degree programme is affiliated to the Dibrugarh University (DU).

In the academic sphere, the college has always maintained standards of the highest order. Since 2016-17, the college has been imparting M.A. Degree in Assamese, Education and Political Science under KKHSOU. It has also introduced PGDCA course from 2017-18. Besides striving for academic excellence, the college firmly believes in the holistic development of its students. It assigns equal importance to co-curricular activities, including games and sports. The "Cultural Team" of the College is acticular, has always been a force to reckon with in the annual Inter-College Youth Festival and Placement wings. - 1. Admission procedure will be solely on online basis prospectus and application form can be downloaded from the College Website (dcbgirlscollegejorhat.org) after registration.
- 2. For admission into the Higher Secondary 1st Year Class, a student must have passed the High School Leaving Certificate Examination conducted by SEBA or any other equivalent examination.
- 3. For admission into the B.A./B.Sc. 1st Semester Class, a student must have passed the Higher Secondary Examination conducted by A.H.S.E.C. or any other equivalent examination.
- 4. Admission is purely on merit basis. Students with outstanding Sports/Cultural background (represented at District level and above) are given preference subject to submission of relevant certificates from competent authority.
- 5. Reservation of seats as per norms of Assam Govt. will be extended to ST/SC/OBC/MOBC/PH students subject to submission of relevant certificates from competent authority. In case any seat in the reserved category remains vacant, the same will be filled from the unreserved category.
- Qualified candidates will be intimated through SMS.
- 7. In case the candidate is not eligible for core in the first option, the second option will be offered.
- 8. Application will be rejected for the following grounds: i) Grace mark in English. ii) Wrong entry of data.
- 9. No face to face interview, document verification etc will be held for admission during the current academic session 2021-22.
- 10. For authentication scanned and uploaded mark sheets, certificates and all other relevant documents will be verified.
- 11. Students have to upload bank details including IFSC Code, Bank Near and Branch and mobile numbers. while applying for admission.
- 12. A student who does not attend classes for seven days continuous the date of commencement of regular classes, without any information, her admission will and a cally stand cancelled.
- 13. Students, other than 1st Semester, must take admission on the semester as notified by the College Authority, failing which a late fine of Rs. 200/- will be impoded.
- 14. College authority will not be responsible for any wrong statement of facts whatsoever given by the students in their Admission Forms.
- 15. All admissions are provisional and subject to verification of the relevant documents and fulfilment of necessary conditions of the College.
- 16. Admission into the College is governed by the College admission rules. The Principal's decision regarding admission is final and binding.
- 17. Any pressure or interference from any quarter for the admission of a particular student will result in forfeiture of the claim.

ADMISSION

Regular students will be preferred for admission to the Higher Secondary and Degree Programmes. However, students passing the qualifying examination in earlier years will have to submit a gap certificate from competent authority. Candidates having more than three years of study gap are not considered for admission. Students seeking admission in the reserved category must upload scanned copy of the caste certificate at the time of admission. The College authority will have the final discretion for admission into the Higher Secondary and Degree Major Programs.

ELIGIBILITY

Admission will be strictly on the basis of merit. However State Government reservation norms shall be followed for admission into reserved categories.

Students passing out H.S. Examination from this college does not possess any special claim for automatic admission in the Degree Course.



- Candidates who passed Higher Secondary Examination in the Science Stream can take admission in the B.A. Programme.
- 3. Candidates willing to offer Core in Physics must have passed in Mathematics at the Higher Secondary level.
- 4. Candidates willing to offer Core in English and Assamese must have secured at least 60% marks in the concerned subjects at the Higher Secondary level.
- 5. Candidates must obtaine minimum 50% marks in the Higher Secondary level for offering Core in other subjects.
- 6. Candidates qualifying for Core subjects are only eligible for admission into the Degree Course.
- 7. Changes in core subjects under special circumstances can be done within 10 days from the beginning of classes.

REGULATIONS

- RAGGING is PROMPATED within the College premises. Student found to be involved in any form of rage the expelled from the College. The Anti-Ragging the of the College is empowered to take action as the necessary.
- ☐ It is the obligatory duty of the students to keep the campus and the classrooms clean. They will be liable for punishment for causing any damage or disfiguring of college property.
- The College gate remains closed till 2 pm. The students are not allowed to leave the campus before 2pm under any circumstances.
- ☐ Students are expected to maintain decency at all times. They should not loiter outside the campus during College hours. Instead they should utilise their off-periods playing games in the Common Room or reading books in the library. They may also contact faculty members for academic consultations.
- ☐ Students must carry their Identity Cards at all times, within the campus.
- Students failing to attend the classes owing to illness have to submit to the Vice-Principal an application along with a medical certificate from a registered physician. For any other absence students shall have to submit application from parents/guardians.

- An attendance of 80% is compulsory for appearing in examinations. Students attaining less than 80% but above 70% will be deemed as Institutional Private candidates.
- □ Wearing of College Uniform is compulsory during College hours. Students wearing improper uniform will be penalized. However for newcomers a relaxation of 7 days is given.
- ☐ It is compulsory for students to appear in the Unit Tests/ Sessional Examinations/Group Discussions/ Class Seminars etc. conducted internally by the respective Departments.
- Students have to participate in extension activities, field studies, and social services organised by the college from time to time.
- ☐ Use of Cell Phones by students in classrooms is strictly prohibited. Violation will invite disciplinary action as well as payment of a fine of Rs. 1000/-. Repeated violation may lead to expulsion from the College. However it may be used in girls' common room when necessary.
- The caution money for laboratory will be refunded provided the students apply for the same within one month of the declaration of the final semester results.

AMENITIES



LIBRARY

The user-friendly College Library, equipped with the latest technology and fitted with CCTV cameras has a comprehensive collection of over 25,000 books on a wide range of subjects, encyclopaedia volumes, current journals and magazines and newspapers of national importance. The open stack system, reference section, book bank, spacious reading room, are all intended to create a lively and enriching environment for students. Books can be borrowed twice a week as per the schedule notified in the Library notice-board. It is open to users, six days a week from 9 am to 4 pm on week days and from 9am to 1.30 pm on Saturdays. Digital Library facility has been introduced in the college from the year 2016. Every Department of the college have their own library to facilitate the students. Study materials are provided by the Department as and when necessary to the students.

COMPUTER LAB

With the introduction of Computer Application as a compulsory subject in the BA/BSc Semester Programme of Dibrugarh University, the College has established three well furnished Computer Labs equipped with latest software and operating systems.

ICT:

Information Communication Technology (ICT) system plays an important role in present day's higher education system. Information Technology Department of the Govt. of Assam in association with the Higher Education Department of Assam has implemented as 40% project in our college from 2016.

PGDCA Course:

The college has introduced a self-off of the course under Dibrugarh University for graduate girls stude the passing out from this college and from other colleges are eligible also admission.

HOSTEL:

The Devi Nivas Hostel provides comfortable and safe lodgings to a limited number of outstation students. Boarders will be under the supervision of the Hostel Warden and Matrons who reside in the hostel and are accessible at all times. Hygenic food, pure drinking water and uninterrupted power supply, internet connection are some of the important amenities available in the hostel.

HOSTEL ADMISSION AND REGULATION

- Only students from outside Jorhat may apply for hostel admission in the separate forms attached with the prospectus.
- ☐ Hostel seats are allotted purely on merit.
- ☐ The Hostel admission list will be displayed after college admissions are completed.
- ☐ Selected students should report to the Warden along with admission receipts.
- ☐ Old boarders must take Hostel admission on the same day of admission into semester classes, failing which their seats may stand forfeited.
- Mess dues are to be paid for the whole year except during semester break.
- There is no provision for half mess dues.
- ☐ Boarders are allowed to leave the hostel only after submitting applications duly signed by their Parents/Guardians to the college authority.
- Admission to College does not guarantee accommodation in the hostel as seats are very limited in the first year.





PLACEMENT CELL:

The Career Counselling and Placement Cell of the College has been established with a view to assist students to discover their aptitudes and talents, to make the right subject choices in college, and career choices in the future. A team of dedicated teacher-counsellors are available academic counselling as well as for consultation and advice on personal and social issues. The Cell organises both pre and post admission orientations, career fairs, skill enhancement and personality development workshops, coaching classes for competitive examinations. Presentations by professional career counsellors and HRD personnel from the corporate sector are periodically organised. The Placement Cell attracts a number of companies every year from various sectors of the corporate world for in-campus placement. Besides, students are groomed for interviews and group discussions.

HEALTH GARE:

YOGA & MEDITATION:

The Yoga and Meditation programme of the College under the supervision of a trained instructor aims at developing the learners mentally and physically so that they may overcome the rising level of stress among them and perform well academically.

The students are provided with smart room facilities to acquaint them with the modern teaching tools.

A language laboratory has been set-up in the college for enhancing language skills of the students. Moreover installation of a virtual classroom is also under process.

CANTEEN:

An airy, spacious canteen provides the right ambience for students and the staff to interact over a cup of tea or coffee. Hygienically cooked Vegetarian and Non-Vegetarian food are available at reasonable prices.

GRIEVANCE CELL:

For the purpose of grievance redressal, the grievance cell, attached to the IQAC, takes into account the grievances of the students.

REMEDIAL TEACHING:

Students with learning difficulties and who are slow learner are supplemented with remedial teaching by the faculty besides the normal College routine.

Besides that the IQAC publishes annually, an international peer reviewed multidisciplinary research journal "INTUIT" with ISSN 2319-2097 & every Department publishes its own journals, periodicals, wall-magazines and news letters.

NSS:

The College has an active and vibrant NSS unit which facilitates the participation of students in social work and community development. At present Prof. Tapan Das is inchatge of NSS Unit of the College.

GAMES, SPORTS & PERFORMING ARTS:

Besides striving for academic excellence, the College also assigns a high degree of importance to games and sports, both indoor and outdoor. At the time of admission weightage is given to students with outstanding sports records (district level and above) and the College supports and encourages players with concessions as well as travelling allowances and entry fees for students participating in tournaments. The college recognises and encourages the enormous talent pool among its students in the field of performing arts. Artists from the college have proved their worth time and again in the prestigious Inter College Youth Festival of Dibrugarh University, state, national and international events. A few seats are reserved for students with outstanding cultural records, subject to submission of relevant certificates from competent authority.

NCC:

DCB Girls' College National Cadet Corps is affiliated to the 64 Assam Girls' Battalion. About 130 cadets are enrolled in the army wing which offers training to students in personality development. Student cadets have opportunities to participate in Republic and Independence Day Parades, mountaineering, shooting and other adventure camps. Over the years our cadets have proved their mettle in the regional and national level NCC camps. NCC cadets of the college have participated in the prestigious Republic Day Parade at Janpath, New Delhi and represented the country abroad in Youth Exchange Programmes. Students who wish to enrol in the NCC wing are required to contact Mrs. Dorothy Momin, Dept. of English.

EXCURSION & FIELD STUDIES:

Trips to various parts of the country are regularly organised for the students, both at the college and Department level. Field studies are conducted by the respective departments as and when requires.

EXTENSION ACTIVITIES:

Besides classroom studies, teachers and students of the college are involved in extension activities in the neighbourhood area. The main aim of the extension activity is to enlighten the people with socio-economic issues and to make conscious the people about human rights and values.
