About the College

Devi Charan Barua Girls' College is the first Under-Graduate girls' college in Upper Assam and second oldest among the women colleges of the state. Since its inception in the year 1955, it has been striving incessantly to spread women education in Assam. The College was established with generous contributions made by the four illustrious sons of Late Rai Bahadur Devi Charan Barua, viz., Heramba Prasad Barua, Umacharan Barua, Deba Prasad Barua and Bishnu Charan Barua. Starting with a modest enrolment of only 56 students and 12 teachers in the Arts Stream, the College has now grown from strength to strength and accommodates about 1800 students from diverse backgrounds, communities and states of North East India in Arts and Science faculty.

Over the years, the College has produced women who have excelled in diverse professions and have contributed in numerous ways to the society at large.

During the 58 years of its glorious existence, the College has not only distinguished itself as one of the premier Degree Colleges of the State but also of the NE Region of India. In recognition of the quality sustenance measures for academic and administrative excellence, the college has been upgraded from Grade "B" in 2003 to Grade "A" in 2011 by University Grants Commission's prestigious accreditation body, National Accreditation and Assessment Council (NAAC), Bangaluru. In fact, D C B Girls' College is the ONLY girls' college of the state till date to be awarded Grade "A" by NAAC.

The Science Stream was added to its wings in 1981 and since then it has developed itself into a full fledged one with well equipped laboratories. The 10+2 programme offered by the College is affiliated to the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC), while its Degree programme is affiliated to the Dibrugarh University (DU).

In the academic sphere, the College has always maintained standards of the highest order. Its students have performed exceedingly well in the examinations conducted by the Council as well as the University. The percentage of success is always higher than that of the AHSEC and DU. Many of our former students were University Toppers and Best Graduates.

Besides striving for academic excellence, the college firmly believes in the holistic development of its students. It assigns equal importance to co-curricular activities. including games and sports. The "Cultural Team" of the College, in particular, has always been a force to reckon with in the annual Inter-College Youth Festival of Dibrugarh University. Its NCC cadets have brought laurels to the College as well as the state by their excellent performances in events like mountaineering, shooting and other adventure sports, including participation in the prestigious Republic Day parade at New Delhi.






ADMISSION:

- Regular students will be preferred for admission to the Higher Secondary and Degree Programmes. However, students passing the qualifying examination Degree Programmes very will have to submit a Gap Certificate from competent authority. Candidates having more than three years of study gap are not considered for admission.
- Students seeking admission in the Reserved Category must produce Caste Certificate in original at the time of admission.
- Right to admission into Higher Secondary and Degree General / Major Programmes will be at the sole discretion of the College authority

ELIGIBILITY:



ADMISSION PROCEDURE:

Application forms along with prospectus for different programmes of study can be obtained on payment of Rs.100/- (for new students) and Rs.50/-(for existing students) by Cash or Demand Draft or by Cross Indian Postal Order drawn in favour of "The Principal, DCB Girls' College, Jorhat. Alternately, candidates can download the Admission Form from our website, www.dcbgirlscollegejorhat.net and submit the duly filled-up Form in the College Office. But they will be required to pay an amount of Rs.100/- at the time of admission.

Candidates possessing requisite qualifications are eligible to apply for different courses of study offered by the College.

NOTE:

Applicants must go through the Prospectus carefully before filling up the Application Form.



GENERAL RULES OF ADMISSION

- Applications for admission must be submitted in the prescribed Form in the College Office within the stipulated dates.
- For admission into the Higher Secondary 1st Year Class, a student must have passed the High School Leaving Certificate Examination conducted by S.E.B.A. or any other equivalent examination.
- For admission into the B.A. / B.Sc. 1st Semester Class, a student must have passed the Higher Secondary Examination conducted by A.H.S.E.C. or any other equivalent examination.
- Admission is purely on merit basis. Students with outstanding Sports/Cultural background (represented at District level and above) are given preference subject to submission of relevant certificates from competent authority.
- Reservation of seats as per norms of Assam Govt. will be extended to ST/SC/OBC/MOBC/PH students subject to submission of relevant certificates from competent authority. In case any seats in the Reserved Category remain vacant, the same will be filled from the Unreserved Category.
- Date(s) for interview/admission are notified on the College notice board. Students selected for admission are required to produce the following documents in Origin at the time of admission:
 - Mark Sheet and Certificate of the last examination passed.
 - Age Proof Certificate.
 - Caste Certificate wherever necessary.
 - A Certificate of good conduct from the Head of the Institution last attended.
- Admission fees once deposited are not refundable.
- Students of B.A. / B.Sc. 3rd Semester must take admission on the specified dates as notified by the College authority, failing which a late fine of Rs.200/will be imposed.
- College authority will not be responsible for any wrong statement of facts whatsoever given by the students in their Admission Forms.
- All admissions are provisional and subject to verification of the relevant documents and fulfilment of necessary conditions of the College.



- Admission into the College is governed by the College admission rules. The Principal's decision regarding admission is final and binding.
- Any pressure or interference from any quarter for the admission of a particular student will result in forfeiture of the claim.

RULES FOR OFFERING MAJOR AND GENERAL **PROGRAMMES:**



- 1. Change of subject(s) including Major is not allowed.
- 2. Candidates who passed Higher Secondary Examination in the Science Stream can take admission in the B.A. Programme. They can also take major in the subject they had in the secondary level.
- 3. Candidates willing to offer Major in Physics must have passed in Mathematics at the Higher Secondary level.
- 4. Candidates willing to offer Major in English and Assamese must have secured at least 60 % marks in the concerned subjects at the Higher Secondary level.
- 5. Candidates must have obtained minimum 50% marks in the Higher Secondary level for offering Major in other subjects.
- 6. Candidates with Grace Marks or who have passed in the Third Division are not eligible for the Major Programme.

REGULATION:

Ragging is strictly banned inside the College premises. Any student found to be involved in any form of ragging will be expelled from the College. The

Anti-Ragging Committee of the College is empowered to take action as and when required.

It is the obligatory duty of the students to keep the campus and the classrooms clean. Any damage / disfiguring of the College property will be liable for punishment.



- Students are expected to maintain decency at all times. They should not loiter outside the campus during College hours. Instead they should utilise their offperiods playing games in the Common Room or reading books in the library. They may also contact faculty members for academic consultations.
- ▶ An attendance of 80% is compulsory for appearing in examinations. Students attaining less than 80% but above 70% attendance will be deemed as Institutional Private candidates.
- Students failing to attend the classes owing to illness / any other reasons have to submit to the Vice-Principal an application along with a medical certificate from a registered physician / application explaining the reasons from parents/guardians.
- ▶ Wearing of the College Uniform is compulsory during College hours.
- Students must carry their Identity Cards at all times, both within and outside the campus.
- It is compulsory for students to appear in the Unit Tests/ Sessional Examinations/Group Discussions/Class Seminars etc. conducted internally by the College.
- ▶ Students have to participate in extension activities, field studies, and social services organised by the college from time to time.
- Use of Cell Phones by students in the College campus is strictly prohibited. Violation will invite disciplinary action as well as payment of a fine of Rs. 500/-. Repeated violation may lead to expulsion from the College.

All fees are to be deposited in the Office Counter in cash during office hours.

AMENITIES:



LIBRARY:

The user-friendly College Library, equipped with the latest technology and fitted with CCTV cameras has a comprehensive collection of over 50,000 books on a wide range of subjects, encyclopaedia volumes, current journals and magazines and newspapers of national importance. The open stack system, reference section, book bank, spacious reading room, are all intended to create a lively

and enriching environment for students. Books can be borrowed thrice a week as per the schedule notified in the Library notice-board. It is open to users, six days a week from 9 am to 4 pm on week days and 9 am to 1.30 pm on Saturdays.

COMPUTER LAB:

With the introduction of Computer Application as a compulsory subject in the BA/BSc Semester Programme of Dibrugarh University, the College has established two well furnished Computer Labs equipped with latest software and operating systems.



Proficiency in English language communication is of paramount importance in the knowledge societies of the 21st century. To enable students to acquire verbal skills necessary for effective communication, the College is all set to install a state-of-the art Language Lab equipped with the latest software and technology.



HOSTEL:

The Devi Nivas Hostel provides comfortable and safe lodgings to a limited number of outstation students. Boarders will be under the supervision of the Hostel Warden and Matrons who reside on campus and are accessible at all times. Hygenic food, pure drinking water and uninterrupted power supply, internet connectivity are some of the important amenities available in the hostel.

HOSTEL ADMISSION AND REGULATION

- Only students from outside Jorhat may apply for hostel admission in the separate forms attached with the prospectus.
- Hostel seats are allotted purely on merit.
- The Hostel Admission list will be displayed after college admissions are completed.
- Selected students should report to the Warden along with admission receipts.
- Old boarders must take Hostel Admission on the day of admission, failing which their seats may stand forfeited.
- Mess dues are to be paid for the whole year except during semester break.



D.C.B. GIRLS COLLEGE

- There is no provision of half mess dues.
- Boarders are allowed to leave the hostel only after receiving applications duly signed by their Parents/Guardians.
- Admission to College does not guarantee accommodation in the hostel as seats are very limited in the first year.

CAREER COUNSELLING & PLACEMENT CELL:

The Career Counselling and Placement Cell of the College has been established with a view to assist students to discover their aptitudes and talents, to make the right subject choices in college, and career choices in the future. A team of dedicated



teacher-counsellors are available for academic counselling as well as for consultation and advice on personal and social issues. The Cell organises both pre and post admission orientations, career fairs, skill enhancement and personality development workshops, coaching classes for competitive examinations, presentations by professional career counsellors and HRD personnel from the corporate sector.

The Placement Cell attracts a number of companies every year from various sectors of the corporate world for on-campus placement. Besides, students are groomed for interviews and group discussions.

HEALTH CARE:

Basic first aid facilities are available in the campus. Qualified doctors and nurses are on call to provide emergency medical attention to students during college hours. The college has a tie-up with Sanjivani Hospital which is a mere five minutes walking distance from the campus. Students and the staff can avail on production of the college Identity Cards, a rebate of 15% on all health care services rendered by the nursing home except the cost of medicines.

YOGA & MEDITATION:

The Yoga and Meditation programme of the College under the supervision of a trained instructor aims at developing the learners mentally and physically so that they may overcome the rising level of stress among them and perform well academically.

VALUE EDUCATION:

The College believes that inculcating the right values to the students would enable them to confront the rigours and stress of the modern complex world. Symposiums on values and art of living are organised on a regular basis.



SCHOLARSHIP & AWARDS:

Meritorious students and others belonging to the socially disadvantaged groups are entitled to a number of State and Central Government scholarships. Scholarship amount is given in the form of Account Payee Cheque in the scholar's name and not paid in cash. Various departmental scholarships are available for meritorious students. Special financial assistance for ST/SC/OBC/MOBC students is also available.

STUDENTS' AID FUND:

There is a Students' Aid Fund for economically disadvantaged but meritorious students in the college. Students securing 45% and above in their last qualifying examination are eligible for financial assistance from the fund. They have to apply in plain paper to the Principal seeking financial assistance along with an endorsement either from Village Chiefs / Ward Members / Teachers of the College.

STUDENTS UNION:

The DCB Girls' College Students Union comprising of elected members and nominated class representatives is the ideal training ground for grooming future leadership and team work. It coordinates between the college and the students and conducts all co-curricular activities under the guidance of teachers. All the students of the College are general members of the body.

Besides striving for academic excellence, the College also assigns a high degree of importance to games and sports, both indoor and outdoor. At the time of admission weightage is given to students with outstanding sports records (district level and above) and the College supports and



encourages players with concessions as well as travelling allowances and entry fees for students participating in tournaments. The college recognises and encourages the enormous talent pool among its students in the field of performing arts. Artists from the college have proved their worth time and again in the prestigious Inter College Youth Festival of Dibrugarh University, state, national and international events. A few seats are reserved for students with outstanding cultural records, subject to submission of relevant certificates from competent authority.

An aesthetically designed modern auditorium hosts major cultural and academic progammes of the College.





DCB Girls' College National Cadet Corps is affiliated to the 64 Assam Girls' Battalion. About 130 cadets are enrolled in the army wing which offers training to students in personality development. 
REMEDIAL TEACHING:

Students with learning difficulties and who are slow and not-so-gifted are supplemented with remedial teaching by the faculty outside the normal College routine.


GENERATOR:
